

# 2018 Flu Vaccine Clinic



As we begin to prepare for flu season, the Green Bay Area Public School District will once again be offering flu vaccines at no cost to District employees. Substitute employees are also eligible.

When: Monday, November 5, 2018 from 2:00pm – 6:00pm  
Tuesday, November 6, 2018 from 2:00pm – 6:00pm  
Wednesday, November 7, 2018 from 7:00am – 10:00am  
Thursday, November 8, 2018 from 2:00pm – 5:00 pm  
Friday, November 9, 2018 from 2:00pm – 5:00pm

Where: District Office Building, 200 South Broadway  
1<sup>st</sup> Floor Gymnasium; first-come, first-served

Cost: Employees – Free for all full and part-time employees, including substitute employees.  
Insurance through the district is not required.

Dependents – Free if dependent has insurance on the District health plan (please bring your insurance card as proof of dependent coverage on our plan).  
\$19 if dependent is not covered on the District health plan.

Note: Dependents must be at least 3 years of age. If a child is under the age of 9, their first dose of the flu vaccine should come from their pediatrician. If the child is under the age of 9 and has received a prior flu vaccine then they are eligible to be vaccinated at this flu vaccination clinic.

What: The flu vaccine is the flu shot (no mist).  
The vaccine is the quadrivalent version, which contains vaccine for 4 strains  
(2 – A strains and 2 – B strains).

While the health and well-being of employees is a priority for the District, as is evidenced by the District paying for the flu shots, we also recognize that you do have other options available when it comes to getting a flu shot. Some things to keep in mind:

- There is **no charge** to you or your dependents covered under the District health plan if you obtain your flu shot at the flu clinic. The District has taken steps to provide the flu shots at a lower cost to the district.
- Many pharmacies offer a walk-in flu shot option. In the event you obtain your flu shot at a CVS Pharmacy you will not have a copay. However, the District insurance plan will experience a cost that exceeds the negotiated price we would pay through our flu clinic. If you go to a pharmacy other than CVS, **you may be responsible for the copay** as it is an out of network pharmacy.
- Office visits to a doctor are also an option. In the event you obtain your flu shot in a physician's office, the cost to you will be the copay for your office visit. The District insurance plan will experience a cost as well, and that cost will incorporate multiple items such as the cost of the vaccine as well as the fee for the professional who administers the vaccine. **This is the most costly of the three outlined options.**
